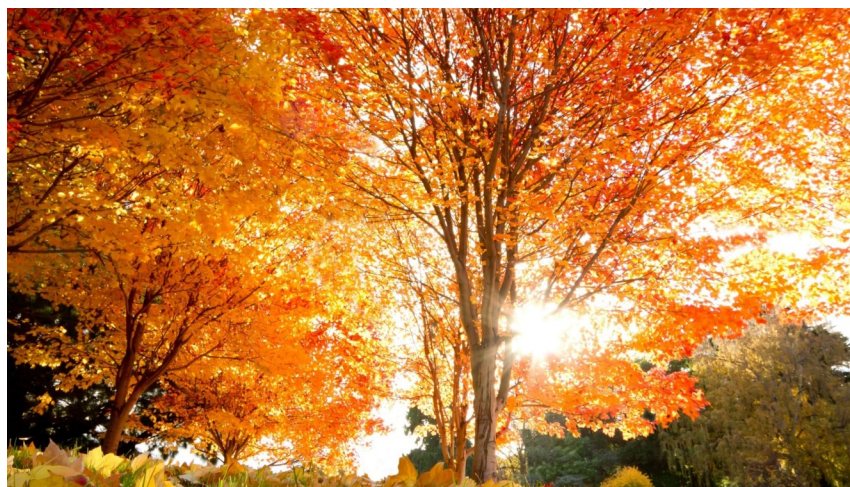

Solicitors:

This is an election year so with this in mind there have been several instances that we have had solicitor who are campaigning for their representative. There is a policy here at Cadgewith Farms of “NO SOLICITATING”. We need help from everyone to ensure that this policy is being enforced here.

If you do have someone at your door and you do not know them it is safest to not answer your door. If you do speak to them let them know of the policy, the sign at the entrance of the community that states the policy and that you will be calling the police. Calling the police is the most important thing that you need to do. Please do not call your neighbor, the office, or even neighborhood watch first. You can reach out to all of them after you call “911”.

Service workers should always have a name tag with the company logo on it. With certain companies they have vehicles with their names on them. Make sure that you are not allowing just anyone into your home.
