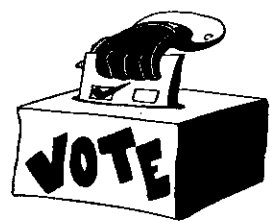
### C.F.A. ELECTION

Please plan on attending so you can meet the new officers and enjoy a nice meal. We are looking forward to seeing you there!!!

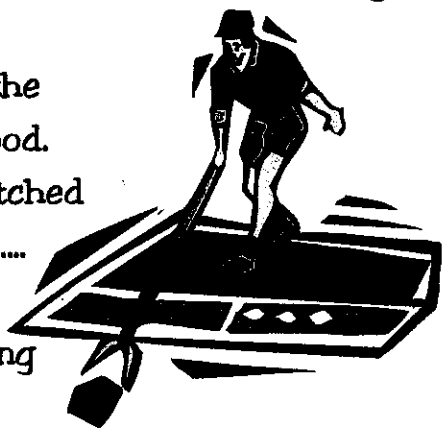

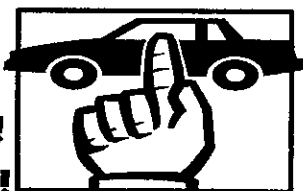
Keep your eyes on the sign in front of the Cluybhouse to inform you of up-and-coming events and any changes that might occur.

This nameless victim's death won't cause a furor.

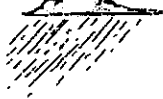
Everyone will suffer when food prices rise,

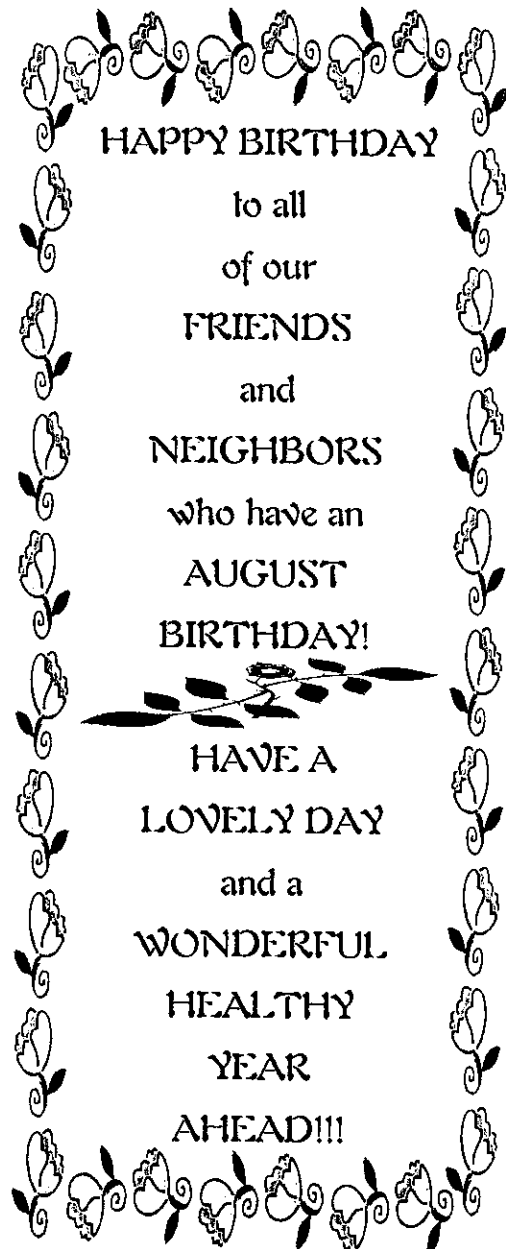



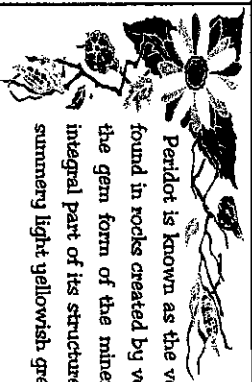
